## Security in Christ

Romans 8:35-39

**V. 35** 'Who (or in the Greek it can mean 'what') shall separate us from the love of Christ?

Believers are 'loved by Christ' and are saved. Another way of asking this is, 'Can anything separate a believer from salvation?'

Paul knows suffering and persecution personally (2 Corinthians 11:23-29)

**V. 36** "Yet for your sake we face death all day long; we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered." (Psalm 44:22)

God's people have always suffered. Clearly death is a very present possibility for the Roman believers. This is the same for the church today.

**V.37** The Roman believers can 'conquer' because of the love of Christ. This conquering does not come from human strength, but from supernatural strength and divine intervention of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 10:16-20).

The Holy Spirit will be with us always in any situation or trial (Psalm 139:7).

**V. 38** Paul answers his question from v35 Nothing can separate the believer from the love of Christ!

"Paul exclaims that it is impossible to be separated from Christ. His death for us is proof of his unconquerable love. Nothing can stop Christ's constant presence with us. God tells us how great his love is so that we will feel totally secure in him. If we believe these overwhelming assurances, we will not be afraid." NIV, Life Application Bible
